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General Manager's Report

I hope all are enjoying the summer season. It has definitely been hot enough to enjoy all of the outdoor activities between the thunderstorms, and both pools are seeing a lot of activity, as are the beaches.

As we all know, last summer, the year of COVID, was a very different type of summer. We were, under those circumstances, very busy with a lot of property owners in WLE. We noticed the increase in numbers last March and many property owners stayed through the year. It was attributed to many people could work from home and felt safer in WLE's rural setting.

This has proven to be another busy summer, with many property owners that I have known for years using the facilities and many that I am just meeting for the first time. There have been many homes

that have been sold in the past year and I am seeing that the new owners are really enjoying having a home in WLE and using the facilities. As in many areas, home sales are booming, and WLE is no exception. More homes have been sold in this year than in quite some time. Right now there is a demand for homes in WLE with a very limited supply.

There are indicators of just how much busier we have been. The obvious ones are the number of cars at houses and people at the pools. Other indicators that are not so obvious are the amount of water usage and trash at the compactors. Another is the number of property owners re-registering their golf carts/UTV's, getting stickers for their vehicles and picking up amenity badges.

If you have been one of those unfortunate people at the office during this busy time, you have experienced the process of what the office staff must go through to detail those three activities, along with

dealing with guest passes, rentals, phone calls, etc. The process itself goes fairly smooth but can take a long time depending on the situation; such as many cars are being re-registered or the proper paperwork is not completed for re-registering golf carts/UTV's. The one problem with golf carts pertaining to insurance is that if it is included on a homeowner's policy, it must state use other than on one's personal property. Policies are changing due to the many uses of golf carts, and at one time when a golf cart was on a homeowner's policy, it was covered while on the policyholder's property. A separate policy for golf carts is available, which many property owners have, but if yours is included on your homeowner's policy, we need a letter from your agent that it is insured on WLE roads, or somewhere in your policy highlighting the area that it is covered to be driven on: WLE private or public roads.

The insurance coverage is important for

the golf cart owner and the Association. There are not many insurance underwriters that will include the use of golf carts on Association roads. The underwriter has a level of comfort with WLE for golf cart use due to the insurance requirement, rules & regulations, checks for WLE-required equipment for new carts/UTV's, written & driving test for kids, and a full time Public Safety Department also helps.

Something during this summer that has become apparent is that we must restructure some of the procedures and/or the administration office. We need to make the operations of re-registering vehicles and golf carts/UTV's and badges simpler and quicker. This will be something we will be working on after the summer to put in place for 2022.

Sewer & Water Report

Sewer Plant and System:

The sewer treatment plant is running well. Flow averages are up, due to more people being at their homes, and some is due to infiltration, as we have had a wet spring causing the ground to be saturated.

Control upgrades are scheduled at both Pump Stations #6 and #3. We are waiting for parts and material to come in.

We are pulling manhole lids searching for infiltration. This is when ground water enters into the sewer system.

We are mapping key areas where we will use our new sewer main inspection camera to locate and identify what type of repair will be needed to fix it. We are also earmarking manholes that also need repairs to stop infiltration.

We had a sewer main backup caused by roots entering a manhole. We were able to unclog the line with our jetter.

Water System:

Well flows are running higher than normal. Some of this is due to having more people in their homes and the other is water leaks. We are leak detecting and trying to find and mark leaks for repair.

The water main flushing that took place this spring was very successful.

The Indian Drive and Ski Bluff water towers were filled for an inspection. The inspections took place. The inspection reports indicate the necessary items that need to be addressed at each tower.

Plans for the Fawn Hill chlorine reduction project have been completed. The plans have been given to some contractors to bid on the project. The chlorine reduction will lower the state regulated 1.55 ppm to 0.49 ppm, which will reduce chlorine taste and smell from this well dramatically. This well currently has the highest mandated chlorine level out of

the six wells.

The Fourth of July holiday weekend, water use had record-breaking water usage, averaging almost 100,000 gallons per day above usage during past years. The week before and after the holiday weekend also averaged much higher flows.

The Water and Sewer Department continues to make sure all State and Federal regulations are being met.

Finally, I would like to thank my staff, Chuck Fenstermaker, Artie Guerra, Marge Kenny and James Stine, for their hard work and commitment to the Water and Sewer Department. Their hard work helps make for a great department.

We were able to take care of most of the damage that night. The following day we did remove a broken half main and replace it with a spare. We also replaced five new anchors with new chains.

Now here is the crazy part, the Maintenance team and Jerry Besko had the unbelievable task of getting the B staircase back in its place. By removing a couple of pieces of the stairs, we could pick up the whole staircase and put it back in its place

in less than a day's work. I never thought we could do that, but with some uplifting talks from John Carney, Jerry, my team and I could make it happen, and I could not be prouder. It's genuinely unique what can be accomplished when there is excellent leadership and one hell of a Maintenance crew.

And with that, I would like to thank the Maintenance crew for all of their dedication and hard work; Cord Rosencrance, Lee Haines, Greg Yurick, Davin Yurick, Colin Stine, Eddie Jordan, Kit Jackson, Espo Esposito, and Dmitri Reggie.



2021 Lake Wallenpaupack Draw Down Schedule

As you may know, 2021 is a drawdown year on Lake Wallenpaupack. This drawdown occurs every 5 years and allows for routine inspections and maintenance on the dam and related facilities. The drawdown is scheduled in the fall to minimize the impact to recreation.

It will take approximately 5 weeks to lower the lake an additional 5 ft. below the normal target lake level for October (1179.0' target). *(As in past years, it is not a requirement to pull docks out earlier than normal, but it is recommended.)*

The following schedule below shows the **approximate** targeted lake levels between Sept. 7, 2021 and October 2, 2021.

ALL BOATS MUST BE REMOVED FROM THE WLE MARINA BY 10/6/2021

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2021 Scholarship Winners









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When Are My Dues Due?

CDC:

The CDC is requesting that a member go past their term date. The Board unanimously denied this request. The

committee is requesting Frank Carrotozolo as the new Chairperson and Carole Rivera as new member, this was approved unanimously.

Building Committee:

A committee resume for the Building Committee was mistakenly overlooked. Due to this situation, it was suggested that the person would serve as an alternate on the Committee until a regular position opens up. Al and John will review the building charter to see if the charter includes alternates.

Public Safety:

There was confusion at last month meeting pertaining to a request for a “No Loitering” at the back parking lot of the MCH. In the morning session the Board voted no for the sign and in the open session it was mentioned that a sign would be installed. It was decided today that a sign will not be installed. The Public Safety Department will monitor the area for excessive noise beyond a reasonable time like other areas are monitored.

Delivery trucks and larger vehicles are having a difficult time turning around when they get to the end of Boathouse Road. Although there is a sign saying “No Outlet,” John is requesting signs to

be added to the street sign with “Dead End.” This would convey a stronger message to all traffic.

Public Safety has experienced the loss of a full-time person. It is being considered to extend the hours of the part-time officers to fill that gap.

Recreation:

Positioning of the Food Trucks, Porta Potties, and dumpsters for the 4th of July picnic was discussed. The Board agreed that the dumpsters would be in the usual place, the Food Trucks would be in some

of the golf cart parking area by the Adult Lodge, and the Porta Potties would be on the other side of the Adult Lodge.

The situation about the feral cats was discussed. The Board of Directors will continue to explore ways to control the situation.

The next open meeting will be scheduled for August 2021.

A motion to adjourn was made and seconded. The meeting ended at 1:30.



Additionally, if you throw lit fireworks from a car, golf cart, or ATV, you will be fined the \$500 and you will lose your RV driving privileges in WLE for 1 year.

The only exception:
short handheld sparklers



The rules and regulations for fireworks will read:

Fireworks: PURSUANT TO PENNSYLVANIA STATE LAW, THE USE OF FIREWORKS IS PROHIBITED IN THE DEVELOPMENT *except for sparklers. A definition of a sparkler is a wire stick held in your hand and covered with a substance that produces sparks as it burns. It looks like a piece of thick wire and burns with a lot of small bright sparks. (8/18/19)* Anyone caught lighting fireworks in the Estates will be issued a \$500 fine. In addition, if any fireworks are thrown from an RV, driving privileges for the driver will be suspended for one year.

New Policy for Vehicle Stickers

1. All Large Vehicle # Stickers are for Property Owners and anyone considered Immediate Family
 - a. Definition of Immediate Family as per the WLE By-laws Section 2, paragraph a: "Immediate family includes: spouse, parents, grandparents, brothers, sisters, sons, daughters, children and siblings in a step family relationship, in-laws and domestic partners of the immediate family, and members of the same household."
 - b. All non-family members get a hang tag.
2. Must show registration to register a new Vehicle to an account or if there is a plate change. If you do not have a registration with you, we can only issue a regular hang tag.
3. All accounts must be current in order to receive a large Vehicle sticker and the small year sticker. If not, we can only issue a red hang tag.

NOTICE TO OWNERS OF ALL RECREATION VEHICLES

INSURANCE EXPIRATION DATE MUST EXCEED DATE OF REGISTRATION BY AT LEAST TWO (2) MONTHS.

ALL ASSESSMENTS MUST BE CURRENT AND ALL FINES IF ANY MUST BE PAID PRIOR TO REGISTRATION.

If your GC is insured under your homeowners policy, please be advised that the homeowners policy must specifically list the GC and that they are aware and it is covered once it leaves your driveway and is being driven on POA roads.




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Stray & Feral Cat Program:



Over the years, WLE has experienced many strays and feral cats around the amenity areas. In the past we have been able to have them trapped and removed by a professional trapper. In this past year, the trapper we used did notify us that he can no longer legally trap and remove cats.

Trapping that is legal is for cats to be trapped then taken to have then spayed and neutered and normally returned to the same area. WLE has entered this program to keep the population down. A cat that had been spayed and neutered will have one of its ears clipped to identify a procedure was done. Though the cat is brought back, it cannot reproduce. If kittens are caught, they can usually be adopted.

If you have any cats around your home and wish to have the same done, you can call C Alley Cats of Lake Wallenpaupack at 570-226-6780. The cost is \$60 per cat. If you wish to donate to the cause for WLE to continue to have cats removed, we are accepting donation in the Administration Building.


